this volume of essays marks the fifteenth year of archival and critical work conducted under the auspices of the recovering the u s hispanic literary heritage project at the university of houston this ongoing and comprehensive program seeks to locate identify preserve and disseminate the literary contributions of u s latinos from the spanish colonial period to contemporary times the contributors explore key issues and challenges in this project such as the issue of its legitimacy and acceptance in the academic canon whether the basic archival phase of the recovery project is complete and if the assumption that there is widespread recognition of the existence and vitality of a centuries long u s hispanic literary tradition may be premature and perhaps imprudent originally presented at the biennial conferences of the recovery project the essays are divided in five sections rethinking latino a subject positions negotiating cultural authority and the canon orality performance and the archive re contextualizing maria amparo ruiz de burton and bibliographic reports covering a wide range of

topics essays include bending chicano identity and experience in arturo isla s early borderland short stories recovering mexican america in the classroom and early new mexican criticism the case of breve resena de la literatura hispana de nuevo mexico y colorado in their introduction editors kenya dworkin y mendez and agnes lugo ortiz give an overview of the editorial framing of the previous volumes in the series and discuss the significant research issues and agendas raised over the past fifteen years this volume like the ones that precede it is bilingual confirming the cultural politics that have animated the recovery project since its inception the understanding that the u s is a complex multicultural and multilingual society

meets the needs of today s teachers and students gathered to meet the upsurge of interest in latin america this collection features major critical articles dealing with the authors and texts customarily taught in colleges and universities in the united states the articles are in english and spanish with a predominance of the former surveys a dynamic and exciting area of research four latin american writers have won the nobel prize for literature guatemalan miquel angel asturias chilean gabriela mistral colombian gabriel garcia marquez and chilean pablo neruda also internationally recognized are the argentine jorge luis borges the mexican carlos fuentes and the chilean isabel allende to name only a few moreover the sociopolitical circumstances of the past four decades of latin american history and the growing importance of the region have resulted in the creation of latin american studies programs in numerous american universities all of this literary activity has inspired innumerable dissertations theses books and journal articles explores contemporary latin american issues and concerns in the face of such an enormous proliferation of commentary students of latin america and its literature need a body of basic texts that will

following the disintegration of the soviet union the globalization of cuban culture along with the bankruptcy of the state partly modified the terms of intellectual engagement however no significant change took place at the political level in community and culture in post soviet cuba de ferrari looks into the extraordinary survival of the revolution by focusing on the personal political and aesthetic social pacts that determined the configuration of the socialist state through close critical readings of a representative set of contemporary cuban novels and works of visual art this book argues that ethics and gender rather than ideology account for the intellectuals fidelity to the revolution community and culture does three things it demonstrates that masculine sociality is the key to understanding the longevity of cuba s socialist regime it examines the sociology of cultural administration of intellectual labor in cuba and it maps the emergent ethical and aesthetic paradigms that allow cuban intellectuals to envision alternative forms of community and civil society

this book focuses on the new chilean narrative published in the historically significant decade of the 90s by a group of writers belonging to the generation of the 80s the analysis of selected texts by ana maria del rio diamela eltit guadalupe santa cruz jaime collyer ramon diaz eterovic gonzalo contreras and alberto fuguet explores the literary strategies by which these writers present literary imageries of deception that question the post dictatorial order in chile the concept of imageries of deception alludes to literary motifs that represent a critical view of a chilean contemporary reality whose source can be traced to the pinochet dictatorship and its ideological aftermath the imageries of deception question the dominant myths that sustain chilean post dictatorial society and remember the nation s ideological conflicts of the past three decades as cultural spaces where memory resists the dominant will to deceptively erase the past the narrative of the 90s reveals the enduring and debilitating impact of a dictatorship successfully disguised as the current neo liberal democracy
